# JULY:

## **AUGUST:**

Southland Construction began the excavation of the underground fuel plume located under the northbound lanes of U.S. Highway 17 North, shifting traffic to the southbound side as single lanes

#### **SEPTEMBER:**

Celebrated the two year anniversary of the DeLeon Dispatch Newsletter with the Fall Edition and an unprecedented 700 copies, distributed at the Taylor 5K, DSSP, River of Lakes Heritage Corridor meetings, Autumn In the Oaks Festival, etc.

Sponsored the Second Annual Taylor High Wildcat 5K September 27<sup>th</sup> with a donation large enough to have our logo in their t-shirts

Launched the Second Annual Ride into Reading Program September 30<sup>th</sup>, expanding the program to include monthly gift card incentives

#### **NOVEMBER:**

Raised funds to create and donate 19 \$50.00 Thanksgiving Food Baskets to the DeLeon Springs Head Start program.

Burts Park Land Lease was approved by Volusia County Council on November 20<sup>th</sup> for an initial 30 years, with completion of the Community Center building to be accomplished within five years

# **DECEMBER:**

Members donated gifts and contributed funds to the Great Kids Angel Tree Program to give Christmas gifts to children in need in DeLeon Springs
